

Artist Profile: Mosaics Group

Every Thursday, from 10.15am to when the artists choose to leave for the day, Artspace 2 at the Trafalgar Railway Station is a scene of considerable 'busy-ness' as the Mosaic Group works creatively to produce a wonderful array of individual mosaic pieces from 2D to 3D. This very inclusive group does not mind if you are a complete beginner but is equally delighted if you

have skills to share. The group is currently working towards an exhibition titled 'Miles of Tiles' in November at 'The Station Gallery', Yarragon.

The Mosaic group is a wonderful example of the importance of being in a group to build knowledge, skills, share ideas and bounce ideas off each other. Newcomers see the mosaic group as one that has enabled them to learn rapidly and gain inspiration for some of the works in the November exhibition.

Members of the group are Elisabeth Smoorenburg, Janet Wyllie, Alene Bonser, Barb Gogerly, Colleen Bright, Dot Thorne, Viv Horden, Tini Cook, Isobelle

Robertson, Kate Richardson, Margaret Darville, Monica Tuffen, Dawn Richmond, Janet McGinn, Gail Munden, Veronica Mitchell, Nicki Haldane.

While not everyone attends each week there is always a sizeable group choosing materials, cutting, and glueing. The Artists have access to a wide range of mosaic

materials such as ceramic tiles, broken china, glass buttons as well as tools like glass cutters and specialized wheeled nippers, side nippers and a score and snap machine.

Each person takes a slightly different approach to design; some gain inspiration from well known artists, both past and present; some are inspired by traditional Roman mosaics. Even the method of drawing or transferring a design to the

surface on which the materials are glued may be different from carefully traced drawings to a sketch as you go method.

On the Thursday I visited, long term participant, Janet Wyllie, was working on an intricate spiral design. Colleen Bright, who now lives in Melbourne and is travelling up to Trafalgar once a month, was creating a 3D piece from broken china. Newer member, Veronica Mitchell, was producing garden pots embellished with glass buttons and these will be in the November exhibition. Like Veronica, Dawn Richmond was also using bright glass buttons. Gail Munden had a clear sketch on a large board of her three Kelpies and one Jack Russell which will

be exhibited.

Don't miss this wonderfully eclectic exhibition in November where the starting point was producing a plant pot and following one's own ideas.

Working on Kurnai country, the Baw Baw Arts Alliance is proud to invite poets from right across Australia to contribute to *Catchment - Poetry of Place* once more, with Gippsland-based writers strongly encouraged to submit poems showing a sense of location.

Our next submission window will remain open between 21st September – 21st November, towards a third issue, due for release online on 21st December 2024.

Again, poems offered will need to show a strong sense of location - perhaps they could evoke picturesque qualities; potentially they might convey an impression of atmosphere or mood; they may even provoke a level of reflection about feelings, ideas or issues attached to a place.

Contributors should look at Submission Guidelines on the Bbaa website for greater detail.

In short, poets from this country can

offer longer poems, as Western free verse; or tanka, following approaches taken internationally with this Japanese-based verse form; or work in both styles.



Localities focused upon throughout Catchment's first two editions have been spread across all Australian

states and territories, with some poems grounded directly in Gippsland, while others look as far afield as places found overseas.

With the team responsible for producing *Catchment - Poetry of Place* only small, my deepest level of thanks - as editor - goes to Marlene and Mike Ogden for doing tremendous work in the IT area, as well as to Sue Murphy for her continued backing on a committee level.

Delighted by support shown by contributors and readers - with both of our previous issues - we hope to continue to offer a broad, generous range of poetry, high in quality, across contrasting styles, with our new edition again featuring striking responses to place from Australian poets, especially those living in the Mount Baw Baw region and across Victoria's south-east!

A Tribute to Dale Plew



Thoughtful, pensive, reflective, meditative, brooding and contemplative, all aspects I wanted to capture in the subject of a charcoal portrait, but in reality, he was just rolling a durrie. This is the man I knew as Dale.

Dale Plew died Sunday night, 22 September 2024, around 9pm. A shock to all, and my thoughts go out to Lyn and family, as do the thoughts of the entire arts alliance community. He will be greatly missed.

Being the subject of a portrait, in a frame, on a wall, in a gallery, did not appeal to Dale in the slightest. It was a massive task to talk him round. Eventually it was settled, with impossible conditions made; - no sitting, no posing! After a lot of thought, the plan was to have Dale roll his smoke in exactly the right position, in exactly right lighting, not hard. That's the story behind the portrait.

My friendship with Dale led him to encouraging me to take a seat at the committee table, one of the better things I've done. However, the following year, I was unable to talk him into doing the same. He also encouraged me to convene my own drawing group. This continues to help improve my art, as well as help to improve the drawing of others, but it also helped me value the work of volunteers, even more so.

I will miss Dale's artwork, funny, dark, strange, familiar, black and white, anything but conventional or compliant. I loved his technique, his last works were done in biro, no graphite, no outline, no safety net, just biro. It would either be in small strokes or dots, expertly applied, resulting in incredible texture and visual display.

Baw Baw Shire Arts and Culture Fund


In 2024 Baw Baw Shire Council's Arts and Culture Advisory Committee (ACAC) applied for Council money for an arts and culture grant program as a one-year trial.

This program provides creatives funding to help them with their own creative projects, training or ideas.

What is the Arts & Cultural Fund?

What can you apply for?

Eligible applicants can apply for a monetary grant of up to \$2,000. You can only apply once in a 12-month period funding year (round 1 & 2 make up the funding year), only one submission per project, per funding year.

You can apply for any amount of money up to \$2,000.

Please be aware - if you are successful, you may not be given the entire amount of money requested. The amount given is at the discretion of the decision panel.

Who can apply?

Residents of Baw Baw Shire or creative practitioners with a creative practice primarily located in Baw Baw Shire.

Organisations and community groups partnering with local creative/s to develop a creative project which will boost the creative practitioner's work and have broad community benefit.

Projects which are located and delivered in Baw Baw Shire.

Residents looking to build their professional development in the creative industries.

The fund strongly encourages

applicants from the creative industries serving youth and/or the First Nations community.

Applicants under 18 years of age can apply but must have proof of consent from a parent/guardian. We will need to confirm in person with a parent/guardian should you be successful.


