### **Artist Profile: Dot Thorne**



I have been drawing for as long as I can remember but didn't start thinking seriously until I was about 30. Realistic and traditional at first, very good training. Then I started abstracting a bit, and using more vivid colours, and lots of imagination, patterns, slivers of colour, splashes, spots, meandering lines. I started with oil paint, have tried every medium, and eventually settled on acrylic paint, mainly because it dries very quickly and I change my mind a lot as the painting progresses, sometimes it takes itself off on an entirely unexpected path. For years I did not paint landscapes, but since moving to Gippsland I find that this beautiful area has seeped into my brain, and hills and trees sometimes emerge.

I enjoy working in 3D. Sculptures in wire, wood, and found objects. Nests, cocoons, and seed pods predominate. Of recent years

mosaic has become my main interest. As with the paintings, colour is the most important thing. No drawing of a design, just time spent sorting the right colour/pattern combinations from my stock of recycled china sourced from Op shops.



Brett Whitely is a favourite artist for his imagination and drawing skills, Fred Williams for his Pilbara series (the colour knocks your socks off), but my favourite artist is John Olsen – his paintings are so free and loose and joyful.

I have had no formal art training but spent 30 years being tutored and mentored by Carol Boothman who is an extraordinary woman, giving invaluable advice on painting, drawing, (and life and dog training), whilst encouraging individual style to develop. I have won many prizes over the years for 3D and 2D work, had one solo exhibition, and taken part in very many group exhibitions. I am very happy to be a member of Bbaa with all the lovely kindred spirits. I love being involved in things, which is why I spent many years as a busy member of the Waverley Arts Society - I used to organise the life drawing class, and was a committee member at the Highway Gallery, curating exhibitions and hanging.

Art is the best hobby in the world, and we can all keep on doing it forever. &

# **Artist Profile: Barbara Gogerly**

Art has been a wonderful adventure which started with paper and pencil, as a child trying to capture that which was around me, but I had to wait until 1984 before painting took hold when I joined Waverley Arts Society.

The teacher who has had the greatest influence on my work was Carol Boothman OAM.



In 1986 I was pointed in Carol's direction by both Marg McLoughlin and Janet Flinn and painted under her wise guidance and encouragement. The stable of artists in those classes and the weekly Life Class was phenomenal, with

inspiration to spare. She has now retired but I still have her words in my mind.

It was in these classes that I met and became friends with Dot Thorne.



Initially it was people and colour that inspired my art but since moving to Yarragon in 2007 the gentle rolling hills, big open skies, and cloudscapes of West Gippsland have given me greater subject matter. I especially love the light at sunset when all the world turns to red gold in those few final moments before the sun sets out past Kerrie Brae.

In 2014 as a member of Bbaa I was introduced to mosaic which I have to say is an addictive art form and not a craft. Classes with Helen Bodycomb, Alene Bonser, Viv Hordern, Lesley Kingston, Cetta Pilati, as well as immersion in the art of Maery Gabriel has been invaluable. I am a member of MAANZ (Mosaic

Association of Australia and New Zealand) and attend their symposia and workshops as able. I follow the work of Helen Knock, Rachel Davies, and Keelly Knickerbocker

Colour still pulls me in, although since the 2019 MAANZ Symposium, I have been doing quite a lot with the earthy tones of slate, marble and natural materials adding just a hint of colour from smalti (small opaque glass tiles).

I have to say It is all good fun and mosaic is a new and wonderful adventure.  $\gg$

### **Artist Profile: Elsa Rabin**

Forty years ago, Elsa Rabin accidentally became interested, with some success, in painting portraits and animals but she found it an expensive hobby. However her interest continued on the discovery of Steven Parrish' photos of Australia which she found inspirational. She sought permission from him to use his photos as a starting point and this was granted.

Elsa's journey to her current style has been an eclectic one through a love of sewing, embroidery, knitting, making dolls, painting, breeding dogs, creating exclusive dog collars sold around the world and back to painting.

Now at 80 years of age, surrounded by the detritus of all these beautiful hobbies, she received a gift of paints and canvasses from her children so began painting again. She believes she has now more than 50 recent works of Art to her name. Elsa draws her inspiration from anything...photos, the internet, friends, family but specifically on looking from a window after her husband passed away she sighted a remarkable Smoke Bush that caught her imagination and inspired her to put paint to canvas.

While she describes her style as haphazard, Elsa has completed some classes with Dave Thomas and developed a clear process for each work of art. She always prepares her canvas with acrylic first because of the faster drying time then paints in oils. Her careful preparation has won her numerous minor prizes and a major one, a first at the New South Wales Canine Council Arts Competition. This was for 'Chinese Crested Dog, an oil on board painting.

Although Elsa has only just begun painting again, she is already looking forward to new directions and hopes to try larger works that her current 23 centimetre square frames. &

Get involved and become a volunteer with 3BBR. Become a presenter, or work behind the scenes to support the real voice of the local community.




